MEET AIDS FOUNDATION EAST-WEST

INCREASING ACCESS TO HIV AND HCV TESTING, TREATMENT AND CARE ACROSS THE FORMER SOVIET UNION



AIDS FOUNDATION EAST-WEST (AFEW) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ANKE VAN DAM KNOWS ALL TOO WELL HOW LITTLE AWARENESS THERE IS OF THE IMPACT HIV AND HCV HAVE IN EASTERN EUROPE AND CENTRAL ASIA, DISEASES THAT HIT DISENFRANCHISED POPULATIONS THE HARDEST.

AFEW used a Gilead grant to provide critically needed support to people living with HIV and HCV in Tajikistan. The organization's efforts to test high-risk populations revealed that approximately 40.3 percent had HCV.

In Ukraine, AFEW used a second Gilead grant to establish a "buddy" program that provides patients a peer who acts as a case manager, facilitating doctor meetings and finding solutions for problems related to medical treatments, work, child care and much more. Since the program began in September 2014, it has helped 50 Ukrainian women who live with HIV manage their disease with hope and confidence.
